




WA State Supreme Court June 2023, on the Washington Voting Rights Act

In Portugal v Franklin County, the Court confirmed that jurisdictions in Washington can adopt ranked-choice voting in order to comply with the WVRA



Without legislative guidance, local governments and courts considering ranked-choice voting must each independently develop their own unique methodology to implement it.



The WA VOICES Act ensures that Washington Administrative Code provides consistent and clear Rules governing the use of ranked-choice voting in Washington.



The WA VOICES Act intends to provide baseline definitions for and requirements of ranked-choice voting elections.




The WA VOICES Act establishes Two Workgroups

What is Ranked Choice Voting?


- Vote for your favorite, just like always

Statewide Public Funding of Elections Democracy Voucher Program




- People Powered Elections Washington Coalition
- Statewide Democracy Voucher Program
- Legislation introduced (HB 1755) & will be updated in next session
- Would cover Legislative District elected positions
- Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) to oversee program
- Possible funding options lobbying fees & fines

Ending Foreign Influenced Corporate Money in WA Elections



Other



- New statewide bill to ban foreign influenced corporations from donating in WA State elections
- 1% Single Foreign Owner or 5% Combined Foreign Ownership
- Seattle passed a similar ordinance in January 2020
- Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) would oversee

HB 1241: Threats against election officials

- As part of the Cyber Harassment Bill passed in 2022, harassing election officials electronically is a class C felony
- Harassing in-person or in a written letter is still a misdemeanor
- HB 1241 makes the punishment the same regardless of the method of delivery



Voter Challenges Cleanup Bill

- Groups are going door-to-door and misinterpreting the results of their canvassing
- The statute for voter challenges is out-of-date
- The bill will allow counties to take administrative action in many cases, without a formal hearing



Simplifying address changes

- The current statute has not been updated since we went to a statewide voter registration system (VoteWA)
- This bill will voters to be transferred between counties based on National Change of Address or ERIC data
- And will allow phone call or email changes instead of requiring to submit a new voter registration form
